Time line:

pre '92 - Several years spent to investigate and consider the possibility and probability of HAHS volunteers completing a valuable, comprehensive book of Forrest County history. Time estimate - 5 years!

1992 - December - Decision made to take the leap.

1993 - January - Officers and Directors agreed and were authorised to serve until project completed.

March - Actual work began.

1994 - 1995 - 1996 - HAHS volunteers spread news county wide and beyond soliciting information with programs and wordshops, through the media and verbally. Volunteers continue processing, organizing, and computerizing.

1997 - Completion. (By Faith!!!)

Pre-publication price of \$49.25 (+ \$3.25 MS tax) will change when contract with publisher is signed.
