Our Current Exhibit

“School days, school days, dear old golden rule days. Reading and writing and ‘rithmetic....” Most former students remember this tune. Even more students may remember the chant, “No more pencils; no more books....” In the class time that came between the two rhymes many more memories were formed.

One must reach a certain age before those memories become dear. One must pass certain milestones before their value can fully be appreciated. For one that point may come on graduation day; for another it may be the first classmate’s death; for yet another gratitude may not come until the 50th Class Reunion. However, no matter who you are, where you’ve been, or what you’ve done, at some point in time you will look back upon your school days with mixed emotions.

You may regret never having purchased a high school ring or selling it for cash to buy trees. You might smile with pride with the realization that a local school has been named for a teacher, friend or relative. You might relive an athletic victory with a teammate. You might laugh over the annual photos depicting your youth. You might talk over the events of high school days with classmates. In an effort to stimulate those recollections, the **Hattiesburg Area Historical Society** museum proudly presents **School Days**. The exhibit features memorabilia from the collection of Brian Blair, grandson of S.H. Blair for whom the current high school building on Hutchinson Street is named. Materials from the HAHS Hattiesburg High School Collection and items on loan from graduates are also included.

Although “reading and writing and ‘rithmetic” have become “reading, keyboarding, computer tech,” you should be honored if you have achieved a Hattiesburg High School diploma or helped someone else earn one. Your challenge now is to continue to encourage the youth of our city to stay in school, to learn all they can learn, and to become educated, productive citizens.
