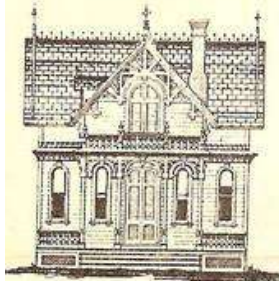


Hattiesburg Area Historical Society

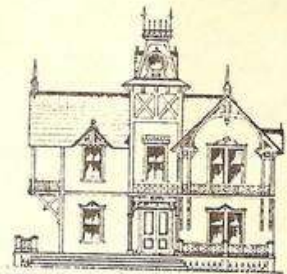


Feature Speaker for the New Orleans symposium is HAHS charter member Ed Polk Douglas who is now Curator of Furniture at the Strong Museum in Rochester, N.Y. The part of the symposium he will present to the HAHS is "From Attic to Auction: Knowing and Acquiring 19th Century Furniture". Slides will demonstrate the lecture and time will be allowed for discussion.

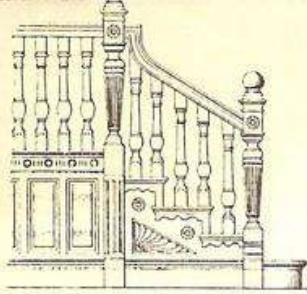
Your program committee felt the opportunity to include this program gratis warrants changing HAHS meeting time and scheduling a program on "Maps" later.
