LOOKING UP THE ROAD

☆ At this April meeting members will be asked to adopt this addition to HAHS's Constitution establishing an endowment fund recommended by the HAHS Board March 1992.

Article III

(d) There shall be established a permanent endowment fund to which contributions of property and money may be made and into which contributions and surplus funds may be placed and invested in reasonably safe securities with the provision that twenty-five (25) percent of the income from such investments shall be retained in the fund and that seventy-five (75) percent of the income may be used for the purposes for which the organization was founded.
