(As we begin our fourth year on this project!!!)
When HAHS embarked on the rewarding task of compiling a hard-cover, archival-quality book of around 500 pages, we first asked groups who had "been there, done that" how long it would take our group to complete this ongoing project. According to our president, Jacq Jones, these groups of enthusiastic historians answered that it would take from three to five years.

HAHS is now on the *fourth* year of gathering "stories" and photographs. We are in the second phase of collecting—the stories we are now accepting are about organizations (churches, schools, civic clubs, garden clubs, etc.). All of our workers are volunteers who donate as much time as they can to this publication. They are elated over the response and the quality of stories we have received.

Over two hundred pages are printer ready after having been read, entered into our computer, and then proofread by our workers and the person who submitted the story. Equal pains have been taken with the photographs.

Until the book is actually published we can still take orders at the pre-publication price of \$49.25 plus \$3.25 tax. As we approach another holiday season, this would be a good time to order a book for someone in your family. A convenient order blank is included in this newsletter.
